Since March 2013, Mr. Riccardo TREMOLADA has been Research Associate at gLAWcal – Global Law Initiatives for Sustainable Development.

Previously he worked as a researcher on projects implemented at Harvard Law School (USA) on Current Trends of Chinese Law towards Non-Trade Concerns (funded by the China-EU School of Law in Beijing) and on the United Nations Development Program (UNDP) assessment to assist the accession of Belarus to the WTO (in particular the TRIPs agreement) both coordinated by Prof. Paolo Farah.

He obtained his combined J.D./LL.M. magna cum laude from the University of Milan (Italy) about “Illicit Nuclear Trafficking: States, non-State Actors and the Quest for Criminalization in International Law”.

His main research areas of interest are Public International Law, International Energy Law, International Economic Law, European Law, International Investment law and Nuclear law.

Since 2014, Riccardo Tremolada is PhD Candidate in International Law at University Federico II in Naples (Italy) and S.J.D. Candidate at Shanghai Jiao Tong University KoGuan Law School with a thesis on “Legal and Institutional Issues in the Pursuit of Energy Security: Shaping Global Energy Governance in Fragmented Frameworks”.
