Professor DENG Haifeng, PhD is a Fellow at gLAWcal – Global Law Initiatives for Sustainable Development and was a EU Commission Marie Curie Fellow and Visiting Scholar (2014-2015) at gLAWcal – Global Law Initiatives for Sustainable Development in the framework of the People Programme (Marie Curie Actions) of the European Union's Seventh Framework Programme (FP7/2007-2013) under REA grant agreement n°269327 Acronym of the Project: EPSEI (2011-2015) “Evaluating Policies for Sustainable Energy Investments: Towards an Integrated Approach on National and International Stage”.

Professor Deng Haifeng is a full time Associate Professor of Law School, Tsinghua University, China, Assistant Dean and the Vice director of the Center for Environmental, Natural Resources & Energy Law of Tsinghua University. His research is focusing on environmental law, nature resource law and energy law.

He has been an official expert and consultant for several legislation drafting on environmental protection and sustainable development such as the revision on the Environmental Protection Act of China; the Prevention and Control of Environmental Pollution by Solid Waste of China; the Circular Economy Promotion Act; the Water Pollution Control Act of China; the revision on the Atmospheric Dyeing Prevention Act.
